

ADVANCING SPANISH LITERACY

Fall 2023 Efficacy Study

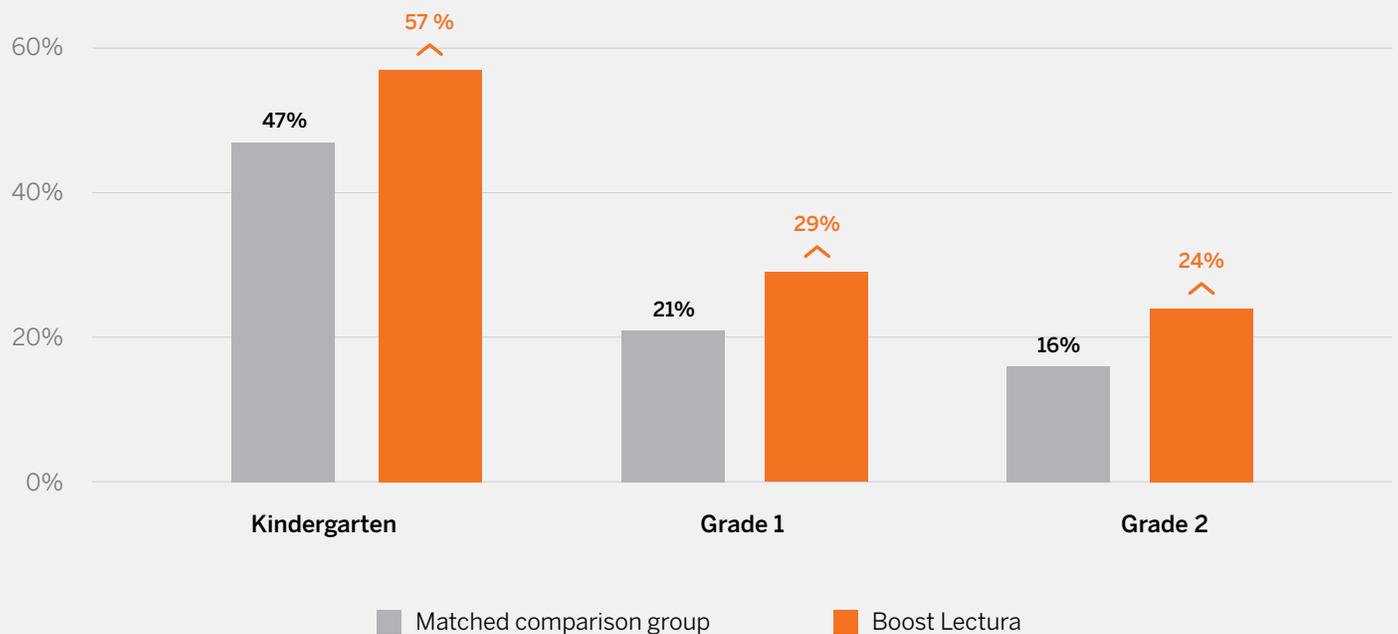
Results for the first semester of Boost Lectura implementation are in: Students who used Boost Lectura for 30–45 minutes a week outperformed their peers on universal screening assessments of Spanish literacy across grades K–2.

On average, students who used Boost Lectura were 38% more likely than non-Boost Lectura students to meet or exceed benchmark by middle of year.

Boost Lectura is proven to support Spanish literacy skills critical for reading development.

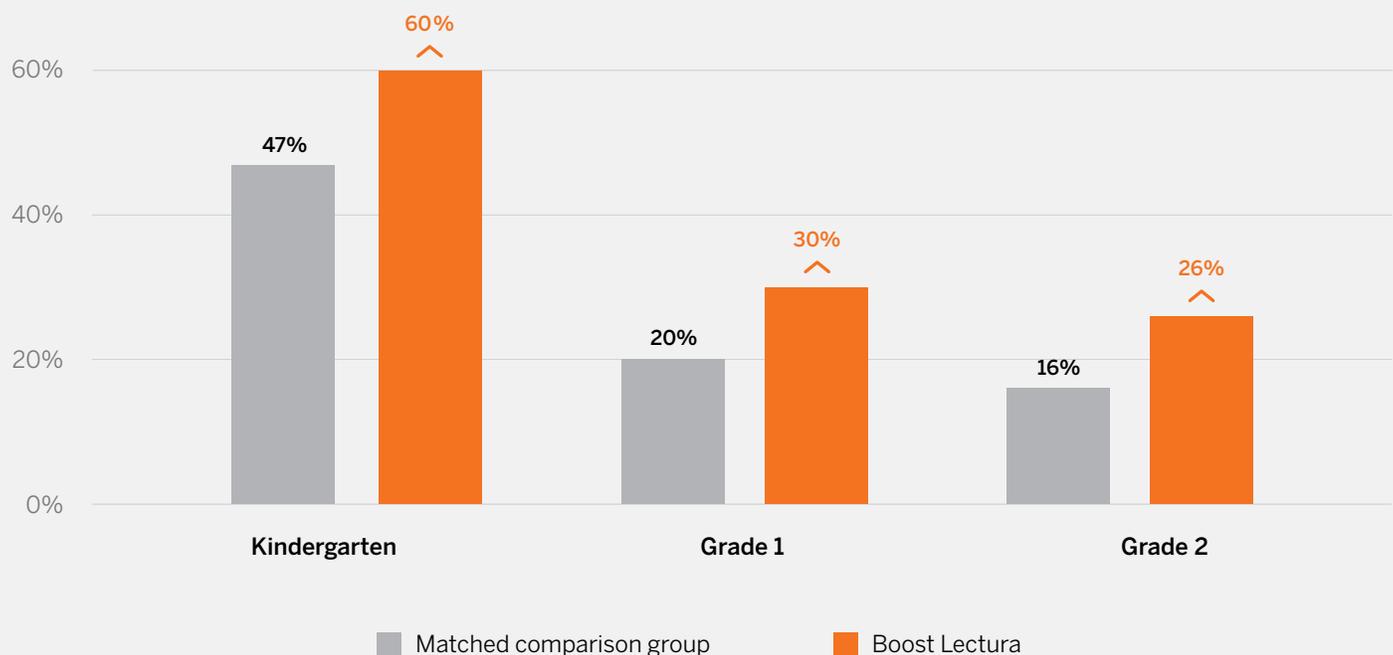
Insight: In kindergarten, 57% of at-risk students who used Boost Lectura for 30+ minutes a week performed at or above benchmark in the middle of the year, compared to 47% of the comparison group.

At-risk students in the beginning of the year were more likely to be on track by the middle of the school year



Insight: For at-risk kindergarten students who used Boost Lectura 45+ minutes a week, 60% performed at benchmark or above in the middle of the year, compared to 47% of the comparison group.

More time spent using Boost Lectura results in more positive Spanish reading outcomes



A personalized Spanish reading program powered by the Science of Reading

Boost Lectura focuses on the skills that research indicates are essential to Spanish literacy development, providing individualized practice in phonological awareness, phonics, vocabulary, and comprehension. Students can use the program independently for 30–45 minutes a week, in school or at home, to learn and practice critical Spanish literacy skills while educators receive detailed reports on students’ growth.

This study meets the qualifications for ESSA Tier 2 Moderate Evidence, showing significant and positive effects on student outcomes.

The sample size included almost 4,900 students who used Boost Lectura for at least 30 minutes a week and a comparison group of more than 50,000 students who did not use Boost Lectura, matched on key student characteristics. Participating students were enrolled in 191 school districts across Texas. Students’ Spanish reading skills were measured using mCLASS® Lectura, Amplify’s evidence-based universal screening assessment of Spanish literacy skills for Grades K–6.
